AYSA OVERVIEW

AYSA staff work on “Big Picture” information:

- ▶ Create league schedules
- ▶ Assign/train referees
- ▶ Host free coach clinics, run camps and programming

Club Coordinators work on the details:

- ▶ Recruit coaches
- ▶ Set fees/host registration
- ▶ Provide equipment and uniforms
- ▶ Create team rosters

If you have a question regarding your schedule, contact AYSA. If you have a team roster/uniform question, contact your club coordinator.

All coaches are required by the Minnesota Youth Soccer Association to complete three main requirements before stepping on the field with their team:

- Concussion Training (every three years)
- Child Abuse Prevention Training (every calendar year)
- MYSA Background Check (every calendar year)

If you coached in spring/summer 2026, you do not have to re-complete your requirements.

Coaches under 18 are not required to complete these trainings (optional) but there must also be an approved adult with them for all games and practices.

PRESEASON COACH REQUIREMENTS

PRESEASON MEETING WITH PARENTS

It is great to start the season with open communication with your team parents. In an email or in person before/after the first practice, we recommend doing the following things:

- *Introduce yourself and your experience level with soccer.*
- *Set expectations for the season (arriving 30 minutes before a game, being positive on the sidelines for games, everyone brings their own ball to practice, etc.).*
- *Share your goal(s) for the season (focus on the fun and excitement of the sport and less on how many games you want to win).*
- *Invite parents to help! It may be with team communication (sending emails when games are cancelled) or as an assistant coach (if you don't already have one).*

Some teams may use one of the many apps for team communication. Decide at the beginning of the season and ask for help to set it up if that's something you want to use.

- ▶ In areas with limited field space, there may be games scheduled on the Sundays for teams. We did the best we could to spread out those games across all teams in each club that are impacted by field restrictions.
- ▶ If there is a game that does not work for the coach or team (school event, vacation, etc.), follow the reschedule process.
- ▶ U12/U14 teams can opt-in to playoffs at the end of the season for an additional guaranteed two games.
- ▶ U6/U8 games are officiated by the coaches. Use your rules summary for more information.

RESCHEDULES/WEATHER CANCELLATIONS

- ▶ If your team is unavailable for one of your game nights (school event, vacation, etc.) you are welcome to contact AYSA and your opponent to cancel the game and begin a reschedule.
- ▶ Games may also be cancelled due to weather/poor field conditions. Coaches are responsible for working with their opponent to find a date for a reschedule.

- ▶ Please try and cancel games at least 5 days before the scheduled game date. This gives AYSA a chance to cancel referees for games (U10-U14).
- ▶ Please allow 4 days for the referee coordinator to assign a referee to a rescheduled game (don't plan to play a make-up game the day after it was cancelled due to weather).

- ▶ Remember, these kids don't need to learn everything about soccer in this one soccer season. Focus on 1-2 things at practice and games, and make sure fun is the focus!

REFEREES (U10-U14)

- ▶ Referees in this program are generally brand new or inexperienced. They need both support and time to develop into better referees. The support can come from you as a coach or parent. Help by encouraging them and accepting their inevitable, occasional mistakes.
- ▶ Do not yell at or address referees directly during the games. Let them focus on their job. If you have a rule question, you can discuss with the referee calmly and patiently at halftime or after the game.
- ▶ If you have a complaint, or if you think the referee was unfair, biased, unfit, or incompetent, report your opinion to the AYSA Executive Director after the game.
- ▶ If you feel a game is unsafe for your players due to the actions of a referee or the opposing team, you may pull your team off the field, effectively ending the game. Please report this action and reasoning to the AYSA Executive Director.

PLAYOFFS (U12-U14)

- ▶ Teams must opt-in to playoffs in early September. You do not have to take part in playoffs. Playoffs are an optional, end-of-season opportunity to play an extra two games (possibly four).
- ▶ Participating teams will be divided into 2 or 3 divisions (Gold, Silver, Bronze) depending on the number of teams participating. All teams will all get a minimum of two games.
- ▶ Playoffs Dates:
 - ▶ U12 First Round - September 15-20
 - ▶ U12 Final Fours/Championships - September 26-27
 - ▶ U14 First Round - September 23-27
 - ▶ U14 Final Fours/Championships - October 3-4
- ▶ PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR TEAM IS AVAILABLE FOR BOTH WEEKENDS FOR YOUR AGE GROUP! Even if your team isn't one of the top teams in their bracket, teams may make it to the second weekend/Final Fours. Please only opt in to playoffs after determining you will have enough players for both weekends of play.
- ▶ An email will be sent to coaches at the end of August with opt-in/opt-out reminders and deadlines to turn in your record sheets. Information is on the coach resource page of the website.

ROLE MODELING AND RESPECT

- ▶ REMINDER - PLAYERS AND FANS ARE WATCHING YOU!
- ▶ Your example is powerful, for better or worse.
- ▶ Focus on fair play, player's enjoyment of the game, and being respectful to all involved.
- ▶ Have fun! It's not the World Cup and these players are not being recruited. Relax and know that the majority of players just want to have fun with their friends.
- ▶ Follow the AYSA Coaches Code of Conduct before, during, and after practices and games.
- ▶ If you are overly concerned about the results, or criticize the referees harshly and/or loudly, people will notice.
- ▶ Coaches that do not follow the expectations in the Coaches Code of Conduct will be disciplined or removed. If a coach is asked to leave a game by a referee due to behavior, they will serve an automatic one game suspension, following a review by the AYSA Executive Director.
